

# THE COREL ZONE

USERS LEARNING FROM USERS ON-LINE

1. Begin by drawing a circle. Holding down the CTRL Key while dragging the cursor will assure you of a circle rather than an elliptical (oval) shape.
2. Duplicate your original circle CTRL D. Resize the Duplicate circle a bit smaller than the original one. Now center it inside your original circle. Your two circles should now look like the ones in Figure 1 below.

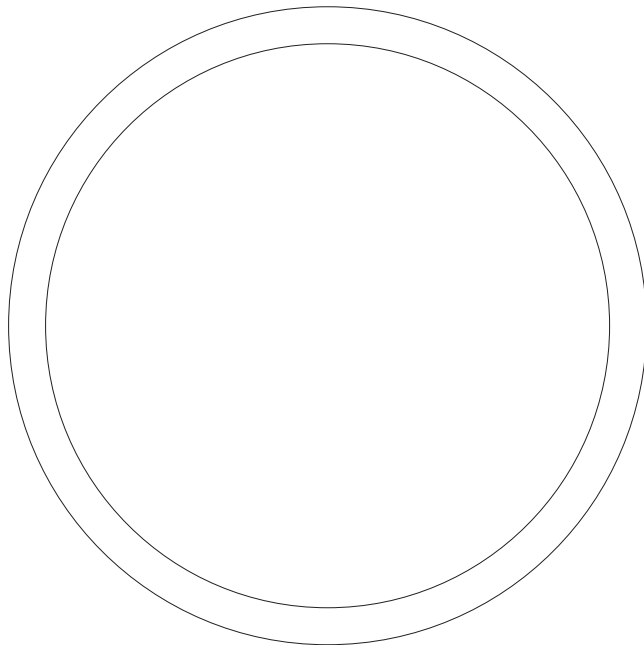

3. Select the Pick Tool and select the outer circle. Open the Fountain Fill dialog box. Set the Type fill to Linear and the Angle to -45%. Leave the Color Blend as Two color (the From color should be black and the To color should be white) Click OK and your outer circle should resemble the one below in Figure 2.

3. Use the Pick Tool to select the inner circle. Bring up the Fountain Fill Dialog Box again. This time set the Type Fill to Radial, set the Horizontal Offset to -20 and the Vertical Offset to 20. Change the From Color to the color you want your button to be. I chose Dark Blue. Click OK. I removed the outline from both circles. That's your option. Your inner circle should look like the one shown in Figure 2 on the next page.

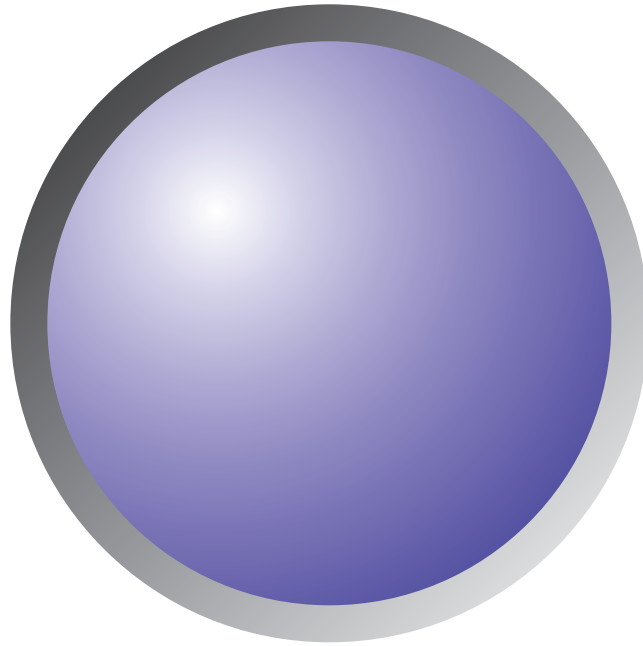

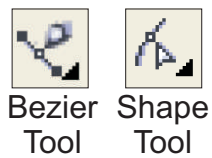

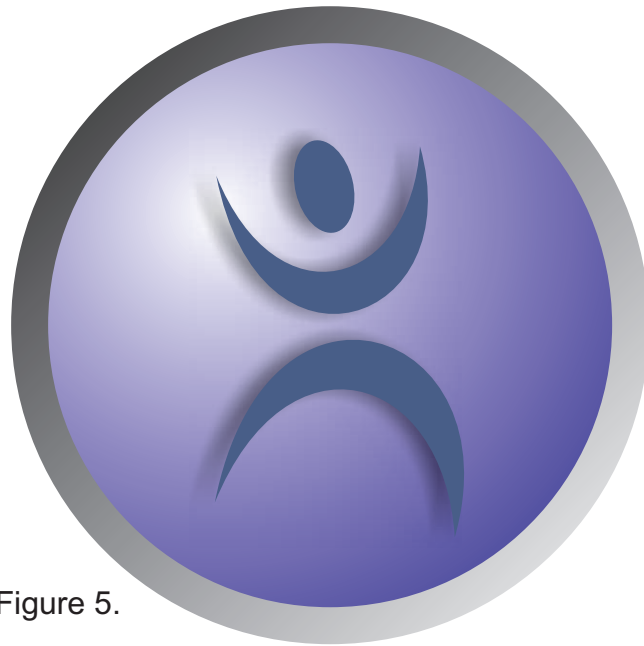
