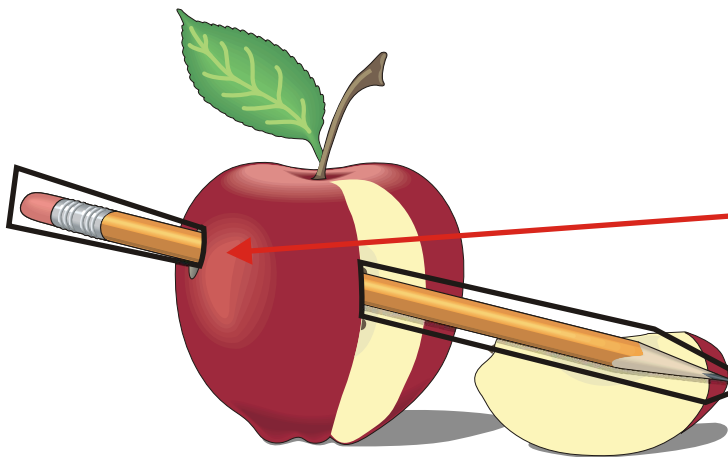


Draw an thin oval and do a two color Radial Fountain Fill going from Light Gray to Black.

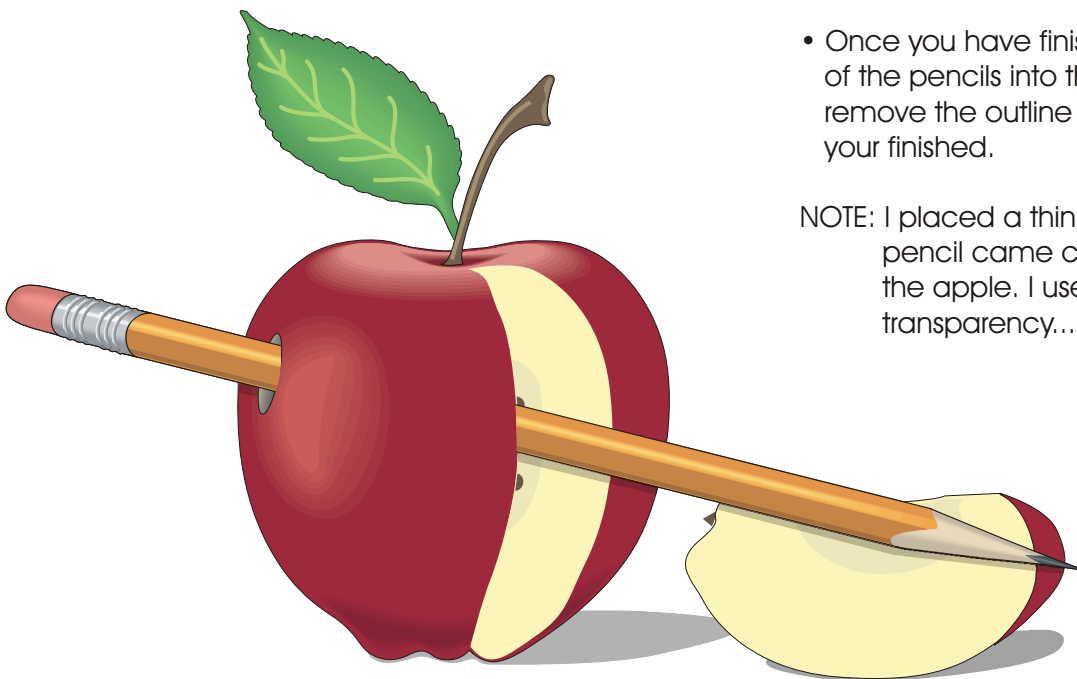
Now position the oval over the pencil right at the point you want the pencil appear as it is disappearing into the pencil.



- Select the pencil
- Move it in front of the apple
- Duplicate the pencil (+)
- You should now have two pencils one directly on top of the other
- Now we will draw the containers in which to Power Clip the two pencils into to give the illusion the pencil is indeed passing diagonally through the apple.



- Next draw the two container that you will power clip the two pencils into.
- The top duplicate pencil will be power clipped into the container located in the **upper left** of the apple and the original pencil will be power clipped into the container you create in the **lower right** area of the apple. See illustration shown left.



- Once you have finished your power clipping of the pencils into the containers simply remove the outline on the containers and your finished.

NOTE: I placed a thin drop shadow where the pencil came close to the surface of the apple. I used a Black fill with 60% transparency.....
